Occupational Medicine Physician at United States Air Force

Dr. Jones is a physician board certified in Occupational and Environmental Medicine by the American Board of Preventive Medicine. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree cum laude from Brigham Young University. He graduated with his M.D. from the State University of New York Upstate Medical University in Syracuse, NY, which he attended on scholarships from the United States Air Force and the university President. Dr. Jones completed a Transitional Year clinical internship at Kettering Medical Center in Dayton, OH where he refined his hospital, emergency medicine, and general medicine skills/knowledge.

Following his intern year, Dr. Jones completed two years of advanced specialty training in Occupational and Environmental Medicine at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health Residency Program. His clinical rotations included many Harvard-teaching hospitals and large Boston-based corporations.

During his residency, Dr. Jones also earned a Masters Degree in Public Health (with an emphasis in occupational health) from Harvard. Throughout his studies and clinical work, Dr. Jones participated in numerous occupational health research and consultation projects with companies from around Boston and around the world. The capstone project for his masters degree investigated the relationship between the built environment of the workplace and lifestyle-related health outcomes among employees.

Dr. Jones has been in the United States Air Force for the last 7 years, and currently serves as an active-duty medical corps officer in his specialty of occupational medicine.
